Sorority Programming

The Sigma Delta Tau Foundation granted \$30,000 through our annual SDT Society Grant to support educational programs hosted by the Sorority, serving collegiate women or collegians.

ELEVATE

SDT's premier leadership experience provided 706 collegiates—representing all 63 chapters—with leadership development skills in an online format.

SAFE, SMART DATING

Developed with Jewish Women International to serve SDT chapters, Safe, Smart Dating explores gender norms and healthy relationships. This grant provided 245 sisters with an in-person experience.

TIGHTROPE

Serving all 1,763 new members, this online student health and safety program is designed to help develop knowledge and skills needed to make empowered decisions to have a meaningful and safe campus experience. This grant reduced the cost of the program by 50% for the Society.

National Scholarship Program

Our National Scholarship Program has been greatly impacted by U.S. market fluctuations over the last few years. Despite the market downturn, 26 women will receive assistance with 2023-2024 tuition expenses through this Foundation signature program.

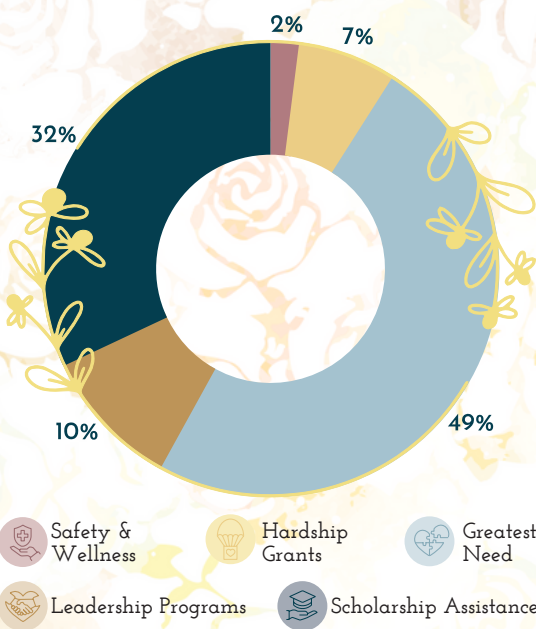
ONE HOPE GRANTS
